For Midland and Gladwin county residents with shoreline erosion challenges because of the May 19 flood

Thursday, June 18, 2020 | 3 pm – 7 pm | Beaverton High School, Gladwin County

Saturday, June 20, 2020 | 10 am – 4 pm | Meridian High School, Midland County

Residents can attend either event no matter where they live.

Talk to engineers and shoreline erosion experts free of charge about how to remediate your property and stabilize your shoreline. Bring photos of your property and erosion damage with you so they can view them and help you create a plan to slow the erosion taking place on your property.

This event is available to residents impacted by the Tittabawassee River flood at no cost to them thanks to a \$100,000 grant from The Patricia and David Kepler Foundation.

Bring With You:

- Pictures of your property and the erosion – see example photos above (it's helpful to include size references such as someone standing on the shore)
- Measurements of your property (i.e. between land and seawall)
- Paper and pen
- Personal protective equipment (PPE) (e.g. mask)
- Driver's license or proof of address

Residents Needing Additional Financial Aid:

- A representative from Four Lakes Task Force will be available to take applications from individuals in need of additional support
- Support will be given to property owners considered high-need
- **TO APPLY:** Bring photos of your property, parcel ID number, proof of address (driver's license)
